Dear Saint Peter's Catholic School Families and Friends,

Thank you to those of you who completed our survey last week. I would like to share the results with you.

Parent/Community Survey: We scored overall, on a scale of 1 to 5, 4.52. This is very encouraging as the average is 4.02. So, thank you for your positive responses! The following are our areas of strength, again on a scale of 1 to 5:

- Our school mission clearly expresses a commitment to Catholic identity; 4.80
- Everything we do in our school is guided and directed by our mission; 4.73
- Our school provides an academically rigorous Catholic religion program, taught by qualified teachers; 4.73
- In all subjects, teachers help students think critically and ethically about the world around them, using the lens of Gospel values and Catholic Doctrine and beliefs; 4.73
- Our school has a clearly articulated rigorous curriculum infused with Gospel values, preparing students for life and work; 4.73
- Teachers use effective instruction to deliver the curriculum; 4.73

Saint Cecilia

November 22. Although there is little historical evidence concerning the life of Saint Cecilia, she is one of the famous martyrs of the Church in Rome. She is mentioned in the list of saints in the first Eucharistic Prayer--Roman Canon. Cecilia is often depicted playing an organ.

Kindergarten students practiced identifying, extending and making all kinds of patterns with the help of our unifix cubes, including AB, ABC, and ABB patterns.




Zoe's mom came to first grade and read us a story. Then we all designed disguises so that our turkeys could escape Thanksgiving.
