The Atrium

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a common religious experience involving children and adults in which the religious values of childhood, primarily those values of contemplation and enjoyment of God, are predominant. This experience is shared in a place particularly prepared for the religious life of children called the Atrium. The Atrium (or prepared environment) is one of the important elements that helps the relationship between God and the child to flourish. After a theme has been presented, the child is free to choose an activity that will make possible the inner dialogue with the "Interior Teacher."

How does the Atrium help to nourish this relationship? ~ The Atrium can be compared to a retreat house facilitating recollection and silence.

The Atrium is a place for religious life, for community and worship—not a classroom for instruction. The Atrium is a place of meaningful work through which the child can have a conversation with God.





K-4 has been learning about Advent in both Atrium and the classroom. This week students worked on their Advent wreaths and glued on their first candle.

K-3 is learning all about the Advent wreath and how it is a reminder, that we are getting ready for Jesus' birthday.





Kindergarten students went on a "time hunt" to practice telling time to the hour. We also worked on our graphing skills!



1st Grade had lots of hands-on fun creating numbers with Play-doh.



2nd Grade has earned tags for learning their prayers. The students earn a tag for orally saying, *The Hail Mary, The Our Father, The Angel Prayer, The Act of Contrition,* and much more. Congratulations 2nd Grade, for learning so many important prayers!





3rd Grade is getting their "shoes" ready for the Feast of Saint Nicholas.



5th and 6th grades had a special visitor come in today to teach song writing. Bonita Wreden helped the students compose their own song. She also performed some of her own selections.

4th Grade had a special tour of St. Peter's Historic Church! We walked through the graveyard and learned about how this church received its historical marker.
