A prayer for the New Year:


Dear Lord,

Pre-K3 is having "Dots of Fun" while working on their fine motor skills.

Pre-K4 has been learning about the Epiphany. Students created mangers after reviewing their <u>Seeds</u> lesson.





Kindergarten kicked off the new year with more time in the Atrium, growing closer to God and in our faith!



1st Grade is spending quality time together, becoming more proficient in their reading skills. Students are reading challenging stories collaboratively with partners.

2nd Grade is discovering different measurements by using Tangrams. The students are learning to measure shapes from Tangrams by using rulers. It's fun to measure all the different shapes! The Tangram forms a square by using all seven shapes.





3rd Grade planned and implemented a science experiment on sound, using construction paper and tape to create hearing aids.



Mrs. Westerfield visited 4th Grade to read a book about polygons. We learned about simple polygons like triangles and went all the way up to decagons! We now know that to be a polygon, a shape needs to have angles and sides. We created and traced polygons to make pictures and used geo boards and rubber bands to create different sided polygons.

5th grade was excited to finish their novel, *I*Am David, about a young boy who escapes from a prison camp and travels 100's of miles to find his mother.





6th grade students are enthusiastically working on their on their new laptops practicing math problems for MAP testing, which begins next week.
